

Alfred M. Pollard

Alfred Pollard serves as General Counsel for the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA).

Supervising the Office of General Counsel includes work on regulatory matters affecting Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac and the eleven Federal Home Loan Banks, representing over \$5.5 trillion in financial assets. Pollard is the Agency's designated ethics official. He has had a leadership role in investigations and enforcement actions and in the 2008 conservatorships imposed on Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. He oversees legal department work related to the Dodd Frank Act of 2010, lawsuits involving securities law violations, state and local laws affecting the regulated entities, compliance matters, corporate governance, contracting, responses to diverse congressional oversight inquiries and implementing inter-agency regulations, including for the Financial Stability Oversight Council. Pollard currently serves on the President's Financial Fraud Enforcement Task Force and the Justice Department's Bank Fraud Working Group. He is a member of the Administrative Conference of the United States.

Alfred Pollard worked as Senior Director at the Financial Services Roundtable, a CEO-level trade group of the nation's largest financial institutions, and as Director of Government Relations for the Savings and Community Bankers of America. For twelve years, Pollard was Senior Vice President and Director of the Washington office for Security Pacific Corporation and, briefly, for Bank of America. Pollard worked on the staffs of two United States Senators.

Alfred Pollard holds a B.A. (with honors; Phi Beta Kappa) and a J.D. from the University of North Carolina— Chapel Hill, and a Ph.D. in Foreign Affairs from the University of Virginia.

Pollard is lead author on a two-volume text on banking law, *Banking Law in the United States* (Juris Publishing) and is author of journal articles. He has testified before Congress and state legislatures on such diverse matters as environmental liability for secured parties, privacy, electronic signatures, legislation to revise the secondary mortgage market and mortgage fraud; he has appeared on national media.

Pollard taught business law as Adjunct Faculty to the Georgetown University School of Business for 25 years, a seminar on law's operation in society at the University of Virginia School of Law for four years, Corporate Law at the George Washington University School of Law, and, in 2014, business law at the George Washington University MBA program.
